

She is a respected crisis management consultant and expert witness in the areas of school violence and peer abuse, and is frequently called upon by the media as an expert interview.

Some of the outlets who have turned to her for commentary include *Newsweek*, USA Today (front page story), CNN, NBC, FOX, "The Joy Behar Show", "Anderson Cooper" and National Public Radio.

She is the go-to expert on bullying related breaking stories for HLN's "Prime News with Mike Galanos," "Issues with Jane
