

The first session of the day is the Blue Bird Product update provided by **School Bus Sales**.



<u>Lea Bogle</u>, President & CEO of Premier Wireless, in her session she will discuss, With Safety on the Line, Overcoming Budget Constraints with Grants. Lea is a dynamic presenter who will show attendees numerous ways to optimize school bus technology. She will share her experiences and highlight the benefits of leveraging technology through the grant process. Don't miss this opportunity to discover effective strategies for enhancing school safety and efficiency through innovative funding solutions.



<u>Dale Anderson</u>, Jester Insurance Services, This session will cover various risk management and insurance related topics about student transportation, including but not limited to claims examples, third-party liability, physical damage to student transportation vehicles, worker's compensation for bus drivers, driver training, and bus safety resources. Attendees will learn about the most frequent and severe types of student transportation vehicle claims in Iowa; how to know if your student transportation vehicles are adequately insured; what are the most frequent/severe types of worker's compensation claims for drivers, and; what

resources are available to assist districts in the prevention/reduction of bodily injury and property damage claims related to student transportation.



<u>Bret Brooks</u>, the chief operating officer and a senior consultant with Gray Ram Tactical, LLC, brings a wealth of experience to his role. With a background as a former U.S. Army Captain and over 13 years in law enforcement, including serving as a SWAT Team sniper and counter-terrorism instructor, Bret offers unparalleled expertise. Additionally, he contributes to academic settings as an adjunct college professor, where he has created, established, and teaches Homeland Security courses for a military academy. Bret will lead two back-to-back sessions focused on critical safety and security topics:

- Concealed Weapon Identification: What School Bus Drivers Need to Know: This session aims to equip school bus drivers with the skills to identify concealed weapons effectively. Participants will learn about the types of concealed weapons, the common places where they might be hidden, and the behavioral cues that might indicate someone is carrying a concealed weapon. This knowledge is crucial for ensuring the safety of students and staff during transportation.
- Indicators of Violence: Verbal & Non-Verbal: In this session, attendees will gain insights into recognizing the early signs of potential violence through both verbal and non-verbal indicators. Understanding these signs can help in preempting and preventing violent incidents. The session will cover various behavioral patterns and communication styles that may signal imminent violence, enabling participants to respond appropriately and maintain a safe environment.

Both sessions are designed to enhance situational awareness and proactive response strategies, contributing to the overall safety and security in educational and public transportation settings.



Ron Gann, Department of Homeland Security is next up with the comprehensive session:

**Insider, Threat Mitigation:** The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has developed a comprehensive Insider Threat Mitigation Program aimed at preventing, detecting, and responding to threats posed by individuals with authorized access to their facilities, systems, or information. This program is part of DHS's broader efforts to enhance national security by addressing potential threats from within the

organization. Ron will provide an overview of the key components of the DHS insider threat mitigation program to educate employees and stakeholders about the nature of insider threats, how to recognize them, and the importance of reporting suspicious activities. Learn how to be prepared by proactively addressing internal risks and enhancing your districts overall security posture.









<u>Day Three</u> continues with a Train-The-Trainor Session for transportation supervisors and school bus drivers. The title of the session: **Train the Trainer: De-Escalation Action Planning for Bus Drivers**, with, Angela Dvorak & Justin Larson

<u>Angela Dvorak</u> and <u>Justin Larson</u> are professional learning and leadership consultants from Heartland AEA who have supported central Iowa schools with crisis prevention training and support for over a decade.

This session is a train the trainer de-escalation training that will include how to build meaningful relationships with students and create a positive and supportive climate on the bus. Participants will gain knowledge on effective nonverbal and verbal de-escalation strategies and develop their own action plan. The training will include a <u>slide deck</u>, <u>bus driver handouts</u>, and <u>videos</u> and can be easily replicated within your school district. Key takeaways:

- Building strong, positive relationships with students is essential for a supportive bus environment.
- Nonverbal and verbal de-escalation techniques are critical skills for bus drivers to manage conflicts effectively.
- Developing a personalized action plan ensures that bus drivers are prepared to handle potential issues proactively.

This session aims to empower transportation supervisors and bus drivers with the skills and confidence needed to create a safe and respectful environment on school buses, ultimately contributing to the overall well-being and security of students.

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
